Suggested activities:

- <u>Spelling/Tricky words</u>: teacher vs pupils how many times can pupils write a certain word *correctly* vs teacher writing the same word on the board with their left/other hand in one minute?
- Months: working in pairs, pupils act out an activity done in a certain month, others have to guess which month it is.
- <u>Compounds</u>: play 'hangman' using only compound words pupils get an extra point for being able to say which two words make up the compound word.
- <u>Contractions</u>: pupils make up pairs of cards with contractions on one and the full form on the other. They can then play 'pelmanism' or 'snap!' with them to match the full form to the contraction.
- Pupil worksheets available separately for download.
