1. CRESCENDO this means gradually getting louder
2. PIANO the Italian word for play quietly $m{p}$

4. BASS this is the clef usually used by the left hand
5. STACCATO this means make the note short and bouncy
6. FORTISSIMO this means play very loundly ${m f}$
7. SHARP this sign tells you to play the note a semitone higher
8. TREBLE the clef usually used by the right hand
9. FORTE this means play loudly $m{f}$
10. ACCENT this means play the note with extra energy >
11. LEGATO the Italian word for smooth playing
12. FLAT this tells you to play the note a semitone lower

There are two crotchets in each bar $\frac{2}{4}$

The key signature of F major – all the Bs are B flats



Play fairly quietly mp

There are three crotchet beats in each bar $\frac{3}{4}$



Play fairly loudly

D.C. (Da Capo) Go back to the beginning again

Gradually getting softer

Tie – play the first note and hold it for the value of both the notes



The key signature of G major – all of the Fs are F sharps



There are four crotchet beats in a bar (common time) $\frac{4}{4}$
