6. FORMSTIOSI this means play very loudly *ff*

- Here are lots of musical signs and facts that you learnt about in Get Set! Piano Tutor Book 1. Can you match up the musical signs to their correct meanings?

There are two crotchets in each bar



The key signature of F major – all the Bs are B flats

Play fairly quietly



There are three crotchet beats in each bar



Play fairly loudly

D.C. (Da Capo)

Go back to the beginning again



Gradually getting softer

mf

Tie – play the first note and hold it for the value of both the notes



The key signature of G major – all of the Fs are F sharps



There are four crotchet beats in a bar (common time)
