



It was a very interesting case, but Monsieur Poirot is amazingly clever. He solved it very quickly. At first, he was confused because many people said they had seen a man in a conductor's uniform on the train and Mrs Hubbard found a button from his uniform in her compartment. Poirot also saw a woman in a blue silk dressing gown on the night of the murder and he didn't know who she was. The dressing gown was then found in my luggage! That was very confusing! I think the moment when Poirot really began to understand what had happened was when Mrs Hubbard found the knife in her handbag. Mrs Hubbard had said that she could not see if the door between her room and Mr Rachett's was bolted because her handbag was over the bolt. However, Poirot realised when he looked at the door that in the even number compartments the bolt was above the handle and not below it. It turned out that Mrs Hubbard was in fact Linda Arden, Sonia Armstrong's grandmother. Poirot worked out that all the passengers except for the Countess Andrenyi, who was actually Sonia Armstrong's sister, stabbed Ratchett - but no one knows, not even me, which blow killed him.
