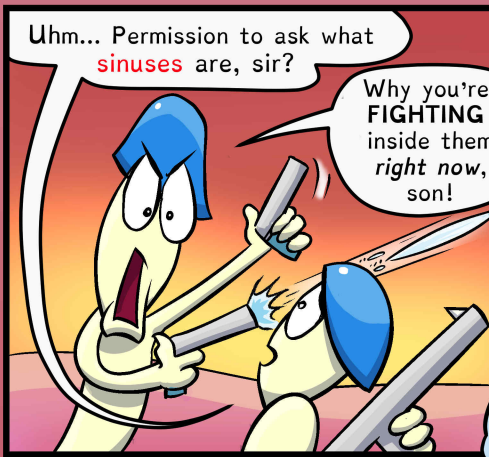
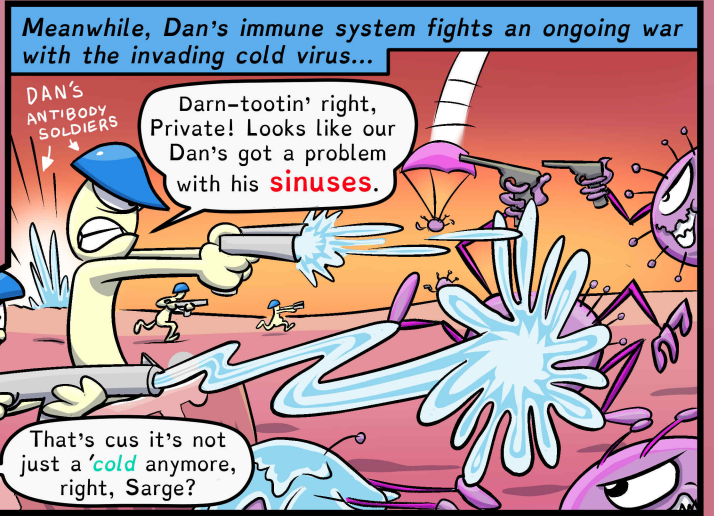
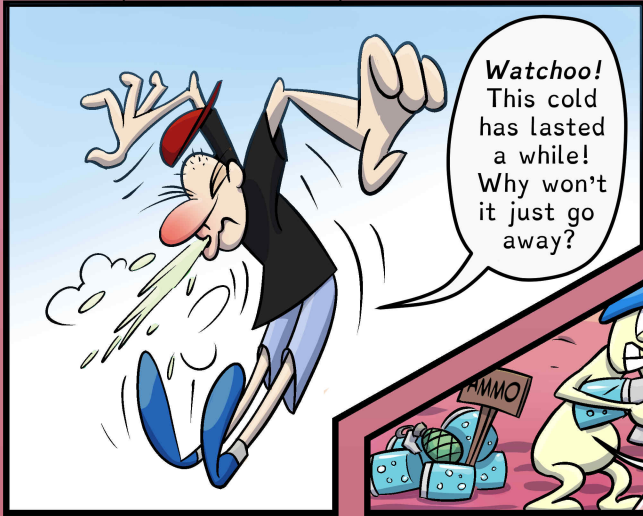
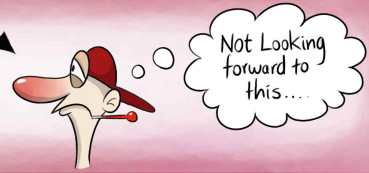






# SINUSES UNDER SIEGE

They're air-filled pockets within the bone of Dan's head and face.


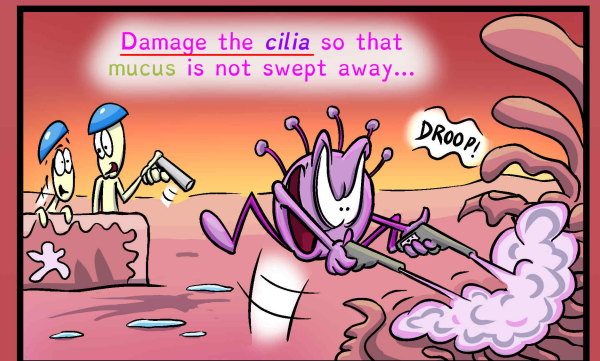
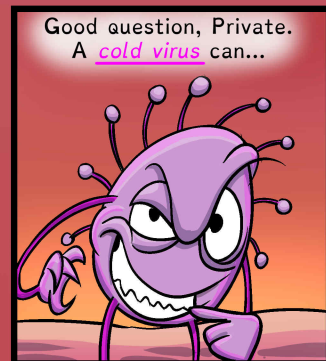
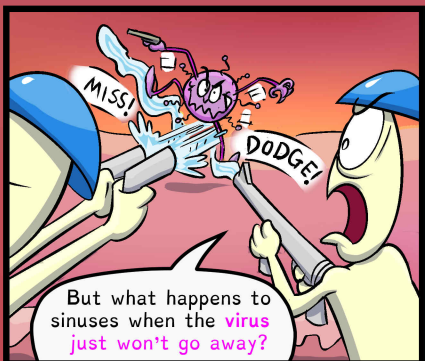
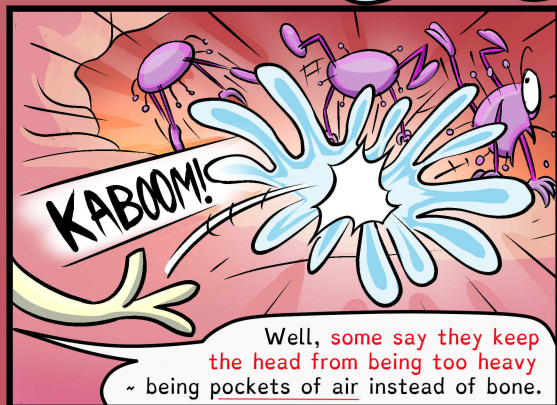
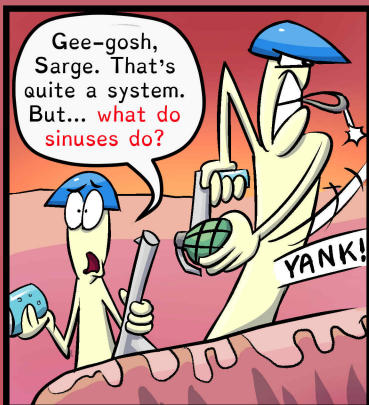
**MUCUS**

Some Nasty Old Trash

Like the nose, sinuses have a thin, moist layer of tissue that creates sticky mucus - trapping things like dust and invading enemies.

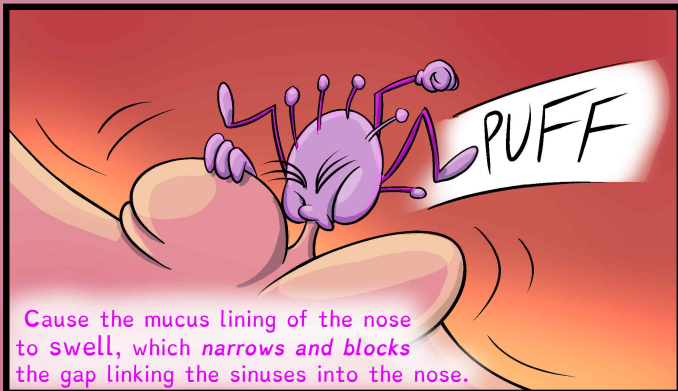
**MUCUS MEMBRANE**

Little hairs called 'cilia' beat back and forth to clear the mucus from the nose, to the stomach where it's burned by acids.

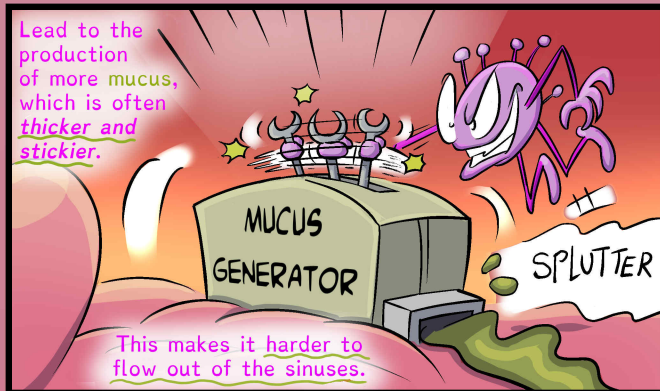
**CILIA**



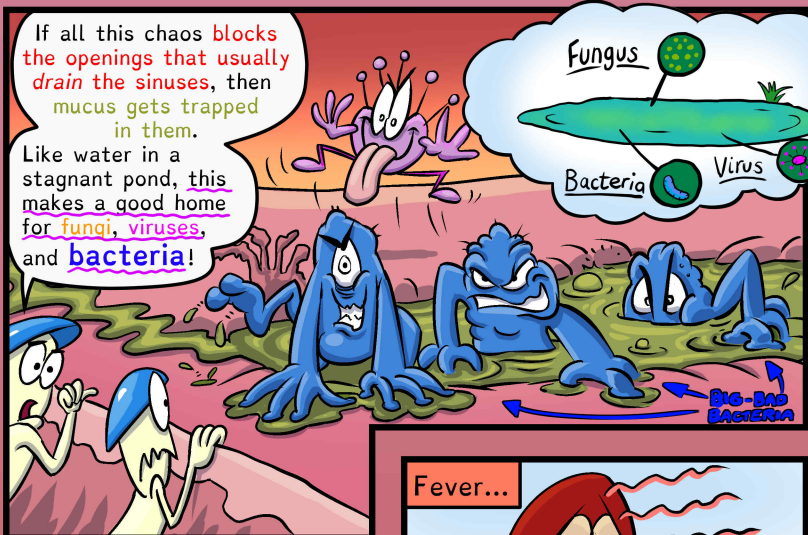


Cause the mucus lining of the nose to swell, which narrows and blocks the gap linking the sinuses into the nose.



Lead to the production of more mucus, which is often thicker and stickier.

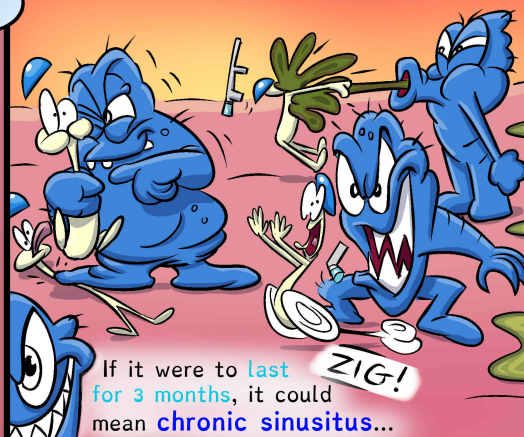
This makes it harder to flow out of the sinuses.



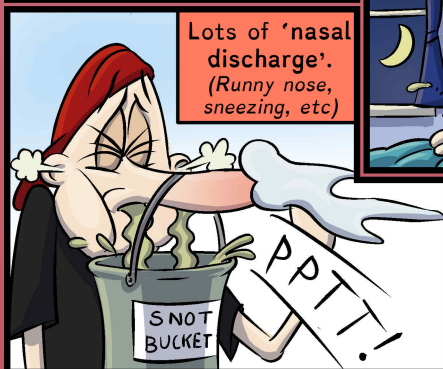
If all this chaos blocks the openings that usually drain the sinuses, then mucus gets trapped in them.

Like water in a stagnant pond, this makes a good home for fungi, viruses, and bacteria!

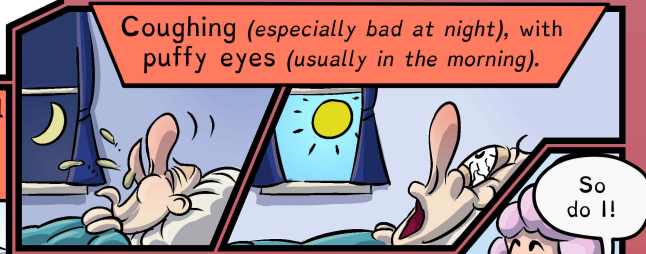
If a cold lasts for more than 10-14 days, it may be a case of acute SINUSITIS - an infection of the sinuses.



If it were to last for 3 months, it could mean chronic sinusitis...



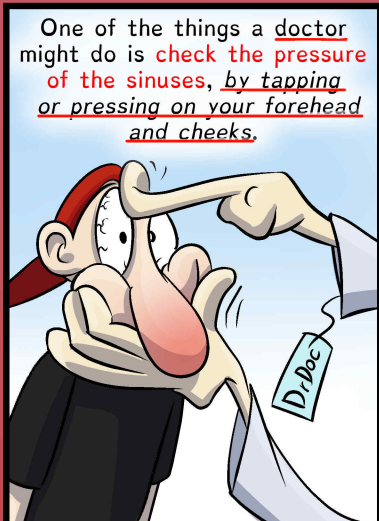
Lots of 'nasal discharge'. (Runny nose, sneezing, etc)



Coughing (especially bad at night), with puffy eyes (usually in the morning).



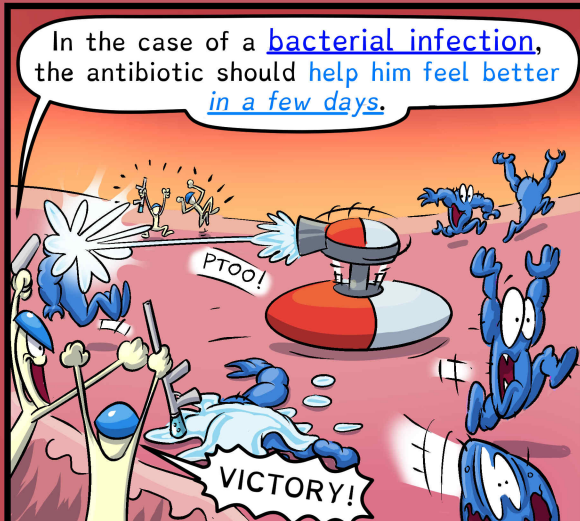
Bad Breath...



One of the things a doctor might do is check the pressure of the sinuses, by tapping or pressing on your forehead and cheeks.

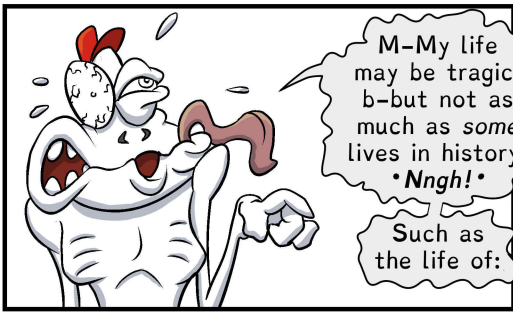


If bacteria are causing the problems, the doctor may prescribe an antibiotic...



In the case of a bacterial infection, the antibiotic should help him feel better in a few days.

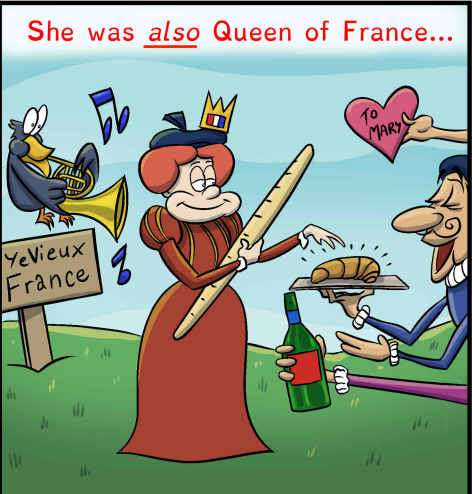

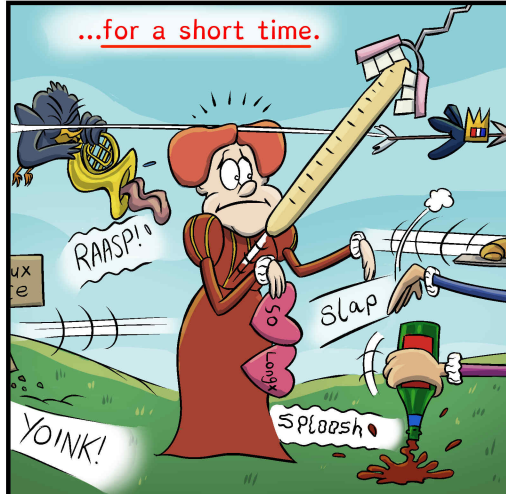
WHO was Mary?

She was also Queen of France...

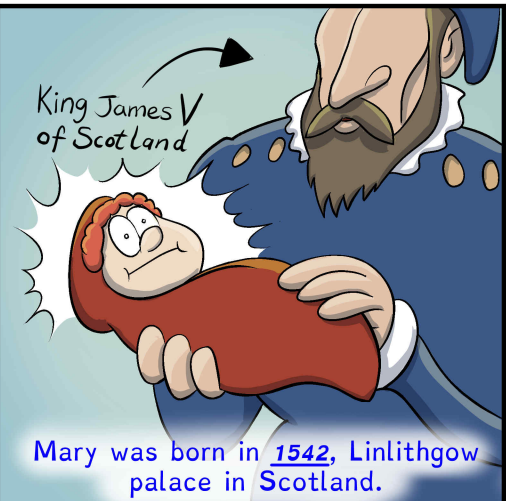


...for a short time.

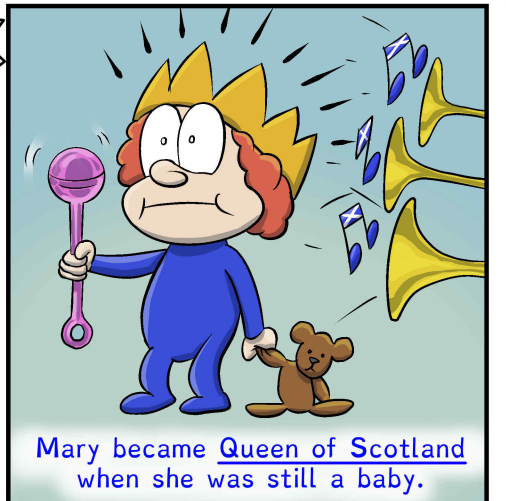


King James V of Scotland

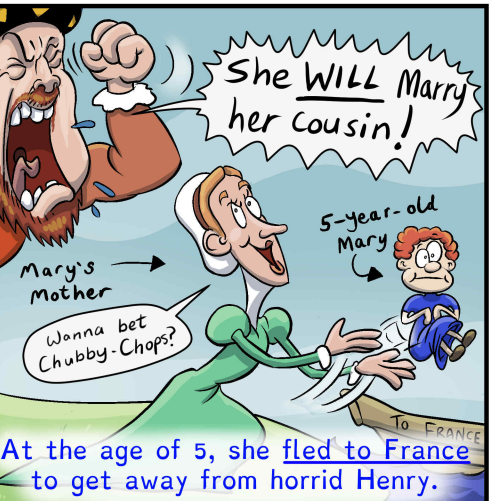
Mary was born in 1542, Linlithgow palace in Scotland.

MARY'S LIFE

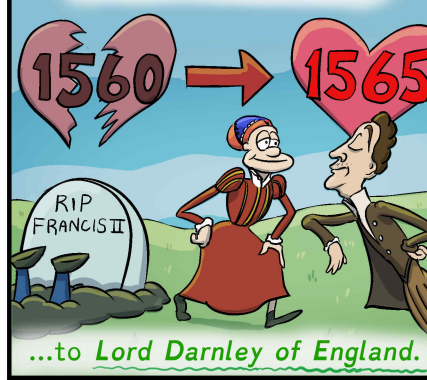
Mary learned to be a "perfect" princess in France. She could speak French, Italian, Spanish, and even Latin.

He copped it in 1560 and she married again in 1565...

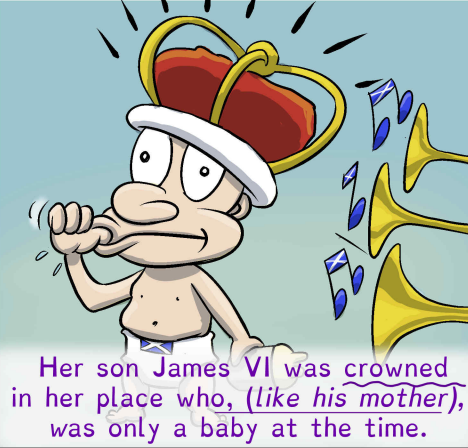
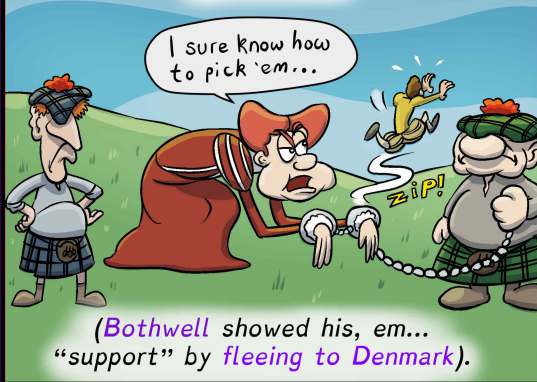


But the poor fellow was murdered in 1567, and her next marriage to the Earl of Bothwell turned the people of Scotland against her.

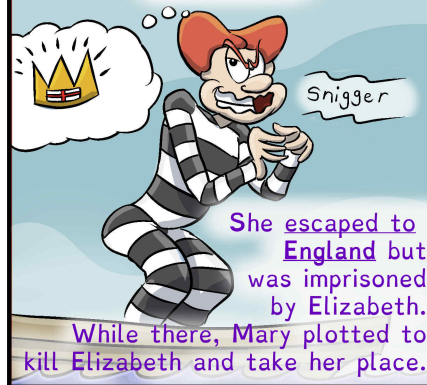


MARY'S DEMISE

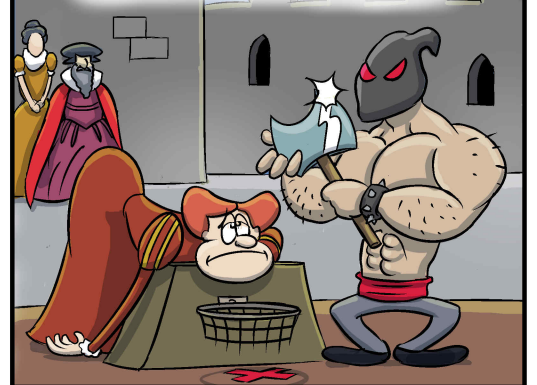
Mary was taken prisoner by her own people.



Mary hoped to become queen again.

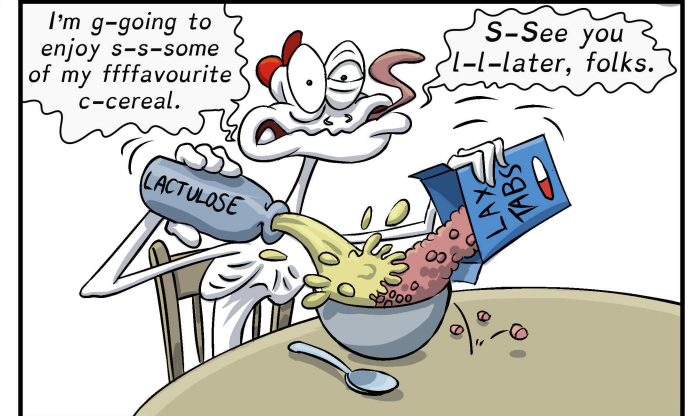


It didn't end well. Mary was executed in 1587.

4. She was arrested while her son was crowned in her place. Executed for trying to kill her cousin.

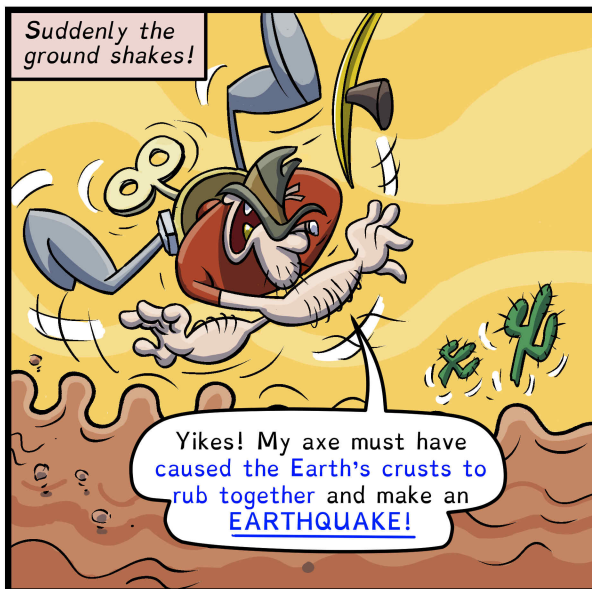
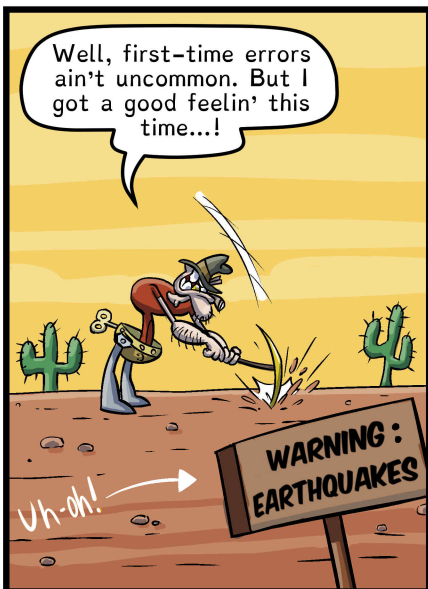
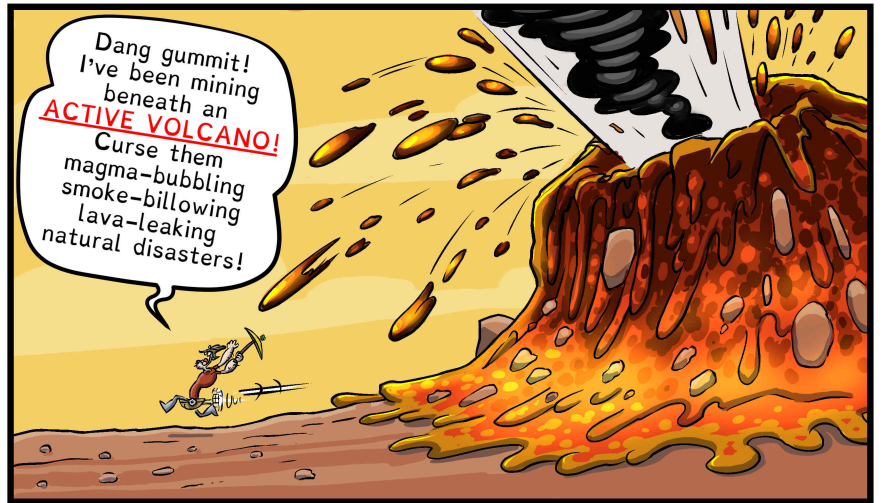
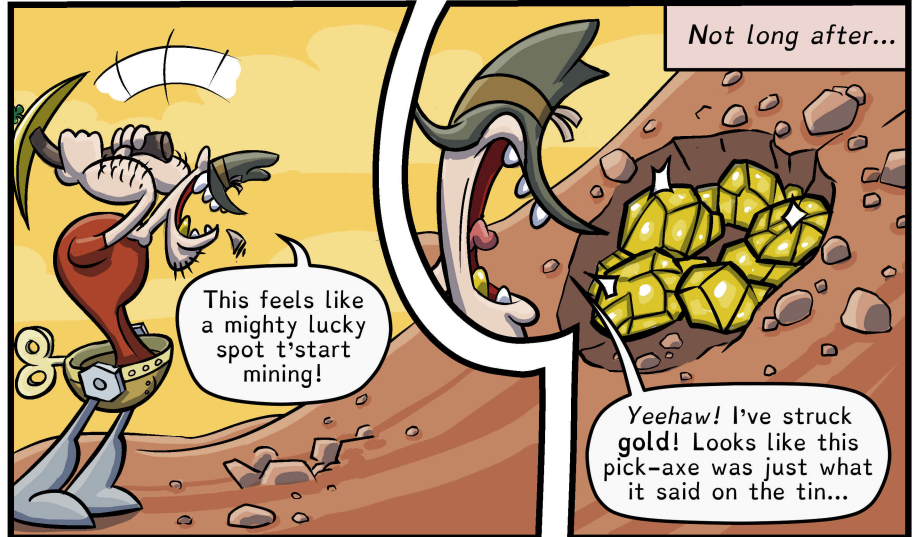




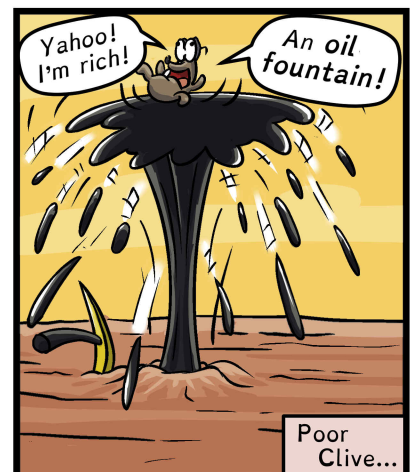
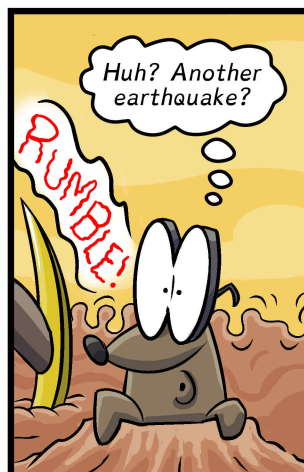
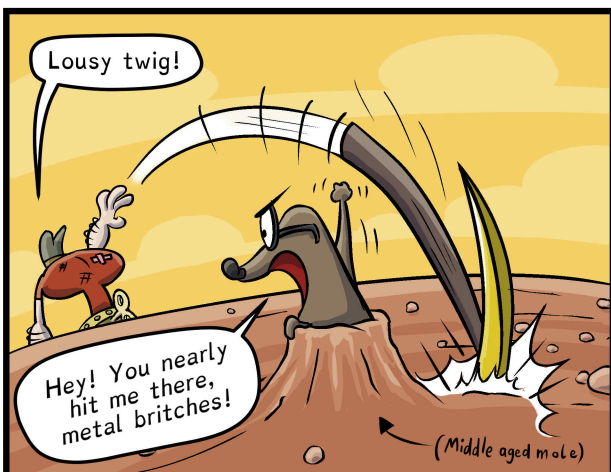
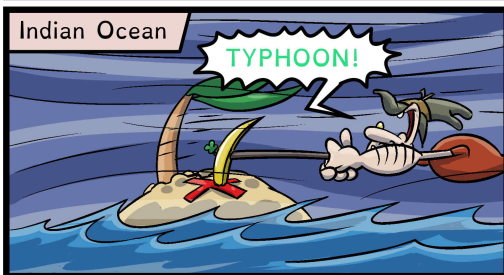
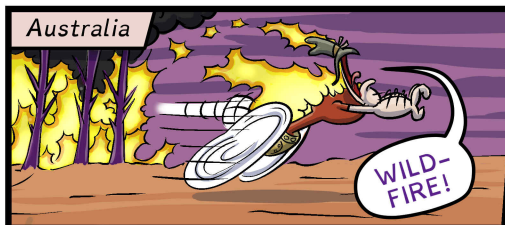
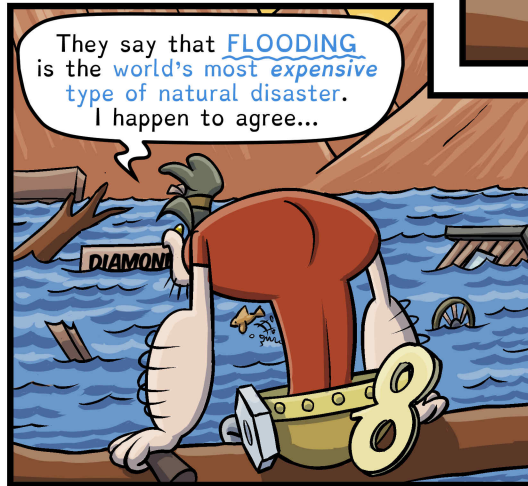
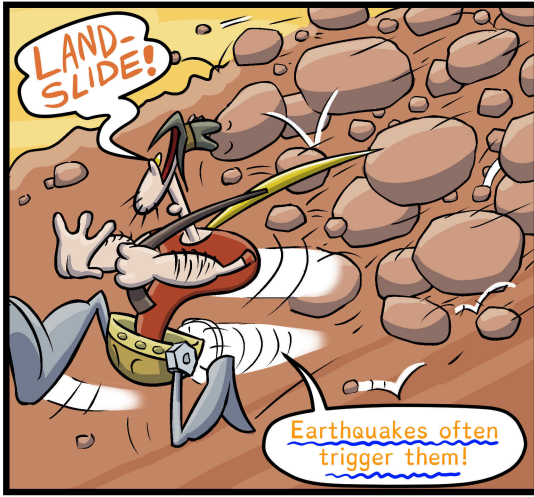
