Page 3: What is the aim of a secret code? (KNOWL)

To hide the meaning of a message.

Page 4: Why do you think is it important for people who do work on the roads and pavement to know what the markings mean? (INF)

Accept answers that relate to the idea of the safety of workers digging up the roads, with better answers linking to electrical safety.

Page 8: Why did the Native Americans use three smoke plumes to signal 'alarm'? (KNOWL)

Three smoke plumes could be seen up to 80Km away.

Page 11: Why do ships no longer send messages using flags? (KNOWL)

Flag signals have been replaced by radio messages.

Page 13: Why do you think Champollion fainted? (INF)

Accept answers that relate to the idea that he was overcome with joy at his discovery.

Page 17: Why is BCE written in **bold text**? (STRUC)

BCE has been written in bold text because it is featured in the glossary.

Page 17: What does BCE mean? (WORDS)

BCE means Before the Common Era: before the birth of Christ.

Pages 36 – 37: Describe what both American troops in 1942 and British Troops in the 1990s had in common. (KNOWL)

They both used a language that was not English to communicate on their radios. In 1942, the American Army, when fighting the Japanese, spoke over the radio in the Native American language, Navajo, which the Japanese couldn't understand. Similarly, when the British Army were fighting in Bosnia, they used Welsh speaking radio operators to cover up their messages.
