




Vocabulary



How to use this book

Each wordsearch in this book contains words that will help to enhance your child's vocabulary. The supporting activity will encourage them to think about the meaning of the words. If there are any words that your child is unsure of, help them to use a dictionary to find the meaning.

- Find a quiet, comfortable place to work, away from other distractions.
- Tackle one page at a time.
- Your child should complete the activity first. They can then look for the words hidden in the grid.
- Help with reading the instructions where necessary and ensure your child understands what to do.
- The words hidden in each grid run across and down (not diagonally).
- There are no words that run backwards.
- Your child should put a ring around each word they find, rather than drawing a line through it. This makes it easier to find words that share letters.
- Help and encourage your child to check their own answers as they complete each wordsearch.
- Reward your child with plenty of praise and encouragement.

Vocabulary terms

- Verb a word with a tense (e.g. past or present) that names an action, state or feeling.
- Noun a word that names a person, place or thing.
- Adjective a word that describes a person, place or thing.
- Synonym a word similar in meaning to another word.
- Antonym a word that is opposite in meaning to another word.
- Compound word a single word made up from two smaller words.
- Root word a word to which prefixes (letters added to the beginning of a word) and / or suffixes (letters added to the end of a word) can be added to modify its meaning.

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
Types of transport
